Public Works Department

Summer is here and we want to remind you of South Ogden City's Storm Drain Regulations.

- No chemicals should be poured into the storm drain system (gutters, storm boxes, etc.) because these empty into drainage fields and streams, which then go into the rivers and water supplies in this area. Chemicals pollute the ground and/or water supplies, harming the environment and habitat.

- When washing your vehicles or other items outside, use environmentally friendly, biodegradable soaps.

- When using pesticides or garden products also use environmentally friendly products. Use garden products (fertilizers, etc.) as directed so no over spray will wash down the gutters. Too much spray will kill your lawn.

Individuals caught dumping the above mentioned items into city gutters or storm drain system will be criminally prosecuted and may be required to pay all costs associated with the cleanup of areas it may affect downstream. Please notify South Ogden Public Works Department at 801-622-2900 if you suspect or witness illegal dumping into our storm drain system.

Hydrant flushing to being in September

Every year the public works department flushes and checks all hydrants in the city to ensure hydrants have proper pressure and work properly. Flushing will be during the month of September. Below are a few question and answers that may be helpful during the flushing.

Why is the water pressure low? Your water pressure may be low due to the flushing of fire hydrants, which lowers the water pressure in the area that is being tested.

Why is my water discolored? Due to the fire hydrant flushing, customers could experience a temporary discoloration of water, which is due to the unsettling of rust in the water main. Run the **cold** water for about five minutes— this should clear up the water.

My clothes have been discolored from the rust, what should I do? You should clean them with a rust remover, such as "Iron Out" or "Yellow Out" which are available at most home improvement stores. To avoid this, run water prior to doing laundry or avoid doing laundry if the hydrants on your street is being flushed.

Is the water safe to drink? Yes. If the water would be unsafe for any reason to drink, a boil alert would be issued. Before drinking the water, let the cold water run until it is clear.

Child and Babysitting Safety Program—The South Ogden Department of Public Safety will be sponsoring a Child and Babysitting Safety program for youth, ages 11-15. This course will provide students with in-depth information from deciding if babysitting is right for you, to how to entertain and properly supervise children of all ages. Other topics include safety, feeding, how to handle emergencies, basic first aid, CPR and the Heimlich maneuver. Part of the curriculum includes training on safety practices when caring for children and first aid procedures which are endorsed by the American Academy of Pediatrics. Upon completion, students will receive completion cards which are nationally recognized, along with their own babysitting tote bag and handbook. Students must attend both days to receive their certificates. The class is offered free of charge, and will be held Tuesday and Wednesday, August 9-10, 10:00 am to noon, and another class August 16-17th, 10:00 am to noon. South Ogden's Department of Public Safety Citizen's Academy—Beginning September 1, 2011, the South Ogden Department of Public Safety is pleased to present our combined Citizen's Police and Fire Academy. This program offers a first-hand look into how police officers and firefighters perform their duties and the various ways they serve the community. The purpose of this academy is to promote citizen awareness and education into the role of the department of public safety and enhance better communication between citizens and public safety employees.

This is a free, six week course; two-hour classes will begin September 1, and run every Thursday through October 6. Interactive, hands on instruction will consist of: K-9 demonstration, narcotics/ strike force, gangs, traffic and felony stops, Emergency Medical Services, vehicle fires, and hose evolutions. We will be touring the Weber County Jail and C.S.I. as well. The training will take place at multiple locations, including the South Ogden Department of Public Safety building and the Driver License Division Range.

Applications are being accepted now. These are available at the public safety building located at: 3950 S. Adams Avenue. Those interested will need to successfully complete a background check; applicants must be 18 years of age or older and must apply in person. Class size is limited, so sign up soon! Bicycle Safety Course—On Thursday, September 8, 2011, at 5:30 pm, the South Ogden Police Department will be hosting a Bicycle Safety Course for children ages 2nd grade through 6th grade. Utah bicycle laws and responsibilities of bicyclists will be taught. Participants will have the opportunity to ride alongside Bike Patrol Officers in a controlled environment to practice following safety measures. Each participant will receive a free bike helmet and will have the opportunity to register their bikes free of charge. Class size is limited, to register please call Cindee at 801-622-2804.

Animal Control—The South Ogden City Animal Control Department would like to present "Shots & Suds" on Saturday, August 27, from 1 to 4 p.m. located at the Animal Shelter, 615 E 5300 S. They will be offering shots for \$10 each which include rabies, 5-way, bordatella for dogs and rabies and cat combo for cats. Also available will be baths for \$6, toenail trim for \$4, ear cleaning \$3, or all three services for \$10.
