## The Mayor's Corner

### Interesting Facts From South Ogden City, Utah History 1948—1984 p. 83

As each of us talk about the past and there are so many interesting stories that we can relate to. I thought that some of these facts would be interesting to each of us. These stories came from those that made South Ogden City, such a special place to live.

- 1862 - South Ogden minutes of neighborhood groups show minutes were recorded in meticulous and beautiful long-hand from 1892 until 1918 by E.F. Bratz.
- 1929 - 5600 South was known as Dead Dog Lane.
- 1934 - Mr. Buckway removed snow from sidewalks on Chimes View Drive with a horse pulling a V-shaped sled.
- 1936 - City paid H.J. Craven, civil engineer and surveyor, South Ogden town site plot \$89.13.
- 1936 - City paid Neil R. Olmstead lawyer services subsequent to incorporation \$25.00.
- 1937 - Town Board purchased truck for \$675.00.
- 1937 - James Ashby given a license for bottled beer -- \$1.00 a year.
- 1937 - A motion was made by Olive Cramer and seconded by R.E. Harper that Mrs. Lillian Chase and Mrs. Margarita Schneiter, widows, be given their beer licenses free of charge. All members present voted yes.

These facts are interesting, especially when you remember them or those that participated in them. I would encourage each of you to keep your personal history to share with those that will follow.

## South Ogden Public Safety Department

**From the Fire Department:** We all know the importance of early warning when it comes to a fire breaking out. In its initial phase, a fire can grow quietly and unknowingly until it is too late to be extinguished easily by a fire extinguisher. A fire more than doubles its size and intensity every 60 seconds, so getting out early literally means the difference between survival and being trapped. Smoke detectors are the leading cause of survival in dwelling fires. And in the state of Utah, having them installed in your home is law.

Smoke detectors can be purchased locally and at virtually any department store. They come in many different configurations, from smoke and CO to infra red and thermal detection. Whichever you choose, make certain that it is a quality detector, with a UL listing (Underwriter's Laboratory). Pick a date annually to change the batteries.

**From the Police Department:** With the Christmas Season ending, fraudulent activities are on the rise, to include forgeries, and identity theft. Please keep careful watch on your identifying documents such as: ID's, checkbooks, and credit cards. Keep a close eye on your bank accounts and report suspicious activities to your bank immediately. Please do not leave purses and wallets in your vehicles, even if your car is in a locked garage. Keep these items either on your person, or secured out of sight at home. Becoming a victim of identity theft/fraud is not an experience we would wish upon anyone. If you are a victim of identity theft/fraud feel free to contact the South Ogden Police Department and we will walk you through the requirements to file a report.

Here are just a few helpful hints.

- Don't give any of your personal information to anyone over the phone, or over the internet, unless you are absolutely sure you know who you are speaking with!
- Pesky "junk" mail and credit card offers: shred all information. By just throwing it away, it allows criminals access to some of your personal information.
- Opt out of the "junk mail" you receive. Contact the Direct Marketing Association at [www.dmchoice.org](http://www.dmchoice.org) and they will send a request to their member organizations to remove your name and address from their lists.
- Contact the three major credit companies and request information on how to protect your identity.
- Empty your mailbox daily. This removes the temptation of stealing your mail.

**Animal Services:** If you have not licensed your dog for 2011, they are due now. Late charges will apply beginning March 1, 2011.

The **Big Fix** will be in South Ogden on Wednesday, February 16th, 2011. Pre-register at the police station 3950 S. Adams Avenue or call (801) 622-2839. Pre-registration for South Ogden City residents first and then beginning February 7th registrations for out-of-town residents will begin as space allows. Prices for spay/neuter are as follows: Male Cat—\$25.00; female cat—\$35.00; male dog—2 to 39 pounds \$59.00, 40 to 59 pounds \$65.00, 60 to 79 pounds \$75.00, 80 to 99 pounds \$85.00 and 100 pounds and over \$1.00 per pound; female dog—2 to 39 pounds \$65.00, 40 to 59 pounds \$75.00, 60 to 79 pounds \$85.00, 80 to 99 pounds \$95.00 and 100 pounds and over \$1.00 per pound.

South Ogden Animal Shelter is hosting a rabies clinic on Saturday, February 19th, 2011 from 12:00 pm until 4:00 pm. Dr. Josiel Lopez and Crestview Veterinary Services will be providing the shots at a very reasonable fee.
