### **Joseph Farrell Shepherd 1974 - 1982**

It is only through great people like Mayor Shepherd with leadership and a desire to serve, that towns can be built and the American way of life can survive.

Joseph Farrell was born May 15, 1917, in liberty, Bear Lake County, Idaho. His parents owned and managed the Liberty Store. Farrell served in the Navy for four years and was discharged until World War II was over in 1945.

Soon after returning home, he met Maxine Berlin from Huntsville, Utah who was a student nurse at Dee Hospital. They were married December 2, 1947. They have five children: Bruce, Shauna, Hal, Kelly and Douglas.

### **Ralph L. Cottrell, Jr. 1983 - 1985**

Ralph L Cottrell Jr., an outstanding leader, was appointed mayor due to the unexpired term of Mayor Shepherd, who left before the expiration of his term.

Ralph was born and grew up in Kaysville, Utah. He married Luda Lee Robinson from Logan, Utah. They have three children: Ralph III, Tracy and Brad.

In his fourteen years of government service, he spent 12 years on the City Council and 3 years as Mayor.

## Call for Candidates . . .

Three city council seats will be open for election this year in South Ogden City. All city council positions are non-partisan, at-large seats and are elected to a four year term. If you are a citizen of the United States, a registered voter of South Ogden City, and have been a resident of South Ogden for 12 consecutive months preceding the election, and are not a convicted felon, you are eligible to be a candidate. You can file your declaration of candidacy (a \$25 filing fee will be assessed) in the office of the city recorder **July 1-15, 2011**, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Mon. thru Friday. To help pedestrians cross any intersection safely UDOT suggests:

- Look left, look right and then look left again before crossing the street at the crosswalk.
- Make sure drivers are coming to a complete stop before stepping into the crosswalk.
- Wear bright clothing to make it easier for traffic to see you when crossing the crosswalk.
- If you're listening to music with headphones on, remove them as you approach the crosswalk.

Cross with care at the crosswalk! **NO** jaywalking will be tolerated!

## South Ogden Public Safety Department

**It's Finally Spring Time!** Yes, it seems that spring is finally here, a time when we can open our windows for the fresh air. It's time to mow the lawn, plant the flowers, take bicycle rides, and so on. It's also a terrific time for thieves to acquaint themselves with our yards. The South Ogden Police Department is asking for your help in limiting the amount of summer time thefts by being aware of the everyday things you do.

- Remember to put your lawn mower, weed trimmer, etc., away. Don't leave them outside. These are very easy for someone to steal, and very hard for us to find. Many of us don't write down the serial number from our tools, so tracking them, even through a pawn shop, is nearly impossible. Write your serial numbers down and keep them safe.
- When you are done riding your bicycle, put it away. Leaving it out on the front lawn, back lawn, or even the porch, makes it a handsome target for someone tired of walking. Remember, write the serial number down!
- If you leave the home, shut and lock your windows. Keep your hard-earned property safe.
- As night falls and you are wrapping up the evening, take a walk around your home. Check your property for anything accidentally left out. Make sure your garage door, shed, etc., is shut and locked. Lock your car doors. Check your home's windows and doors – are they shut and locked? Do you have an outside light that you can leave on, making it harder for thieves to target you?

We cannot stress enough the importance of keeping your vehicles locked. Don't be an easy target. One second of your time is worth more than the hours you may have to spend making phone calls to the police, insurance company, and others if you become a victim.

***A note from the detectives division:*** Burglary and theft related offenses have decreased; likely because good efforts to secure homes and cars have been made. We would encourage our community members to keep up with the good practice of securing property and to report any suspicious activity or related problems to your Police Department. If you have any further questions with how you can prevent burglary and/or theft, please feel free to stop in or call.

## Public Works Department

Spring is here and we want to remind you of South Ogden City's Storm Drain Regulations.

- No chemicals should be poured into the storm drain system (gutters, storm boxes, etc.) because these empty into drainage fields and streams, which then go into the rivers and water supplies in this area. Chemicals pollute the ground and/or water supplies, harming the environment and habitat.

- When washing your vehicles or other items outside, use environmentally friendly, biodegradable soaps.

- When using pesticides or garden products also use environmentally friendly products. Use garden products (fertilizers, etc.) as directed so no over spray will wash down the gutters. Too much spray will kill your lawn.

Individuals caught dumping the above mentioned items into city gutters or storm drain system will be criminally prosecuted and may be required to pay all costs associated with the cleanup of areas it may affect downstream. Please notify South Ogden Public Works Department at 801-622-2900 if you suspect or witness illegal dumping into our storm drain system.
