Each Mayor has gone through a period of great expansion successfully. Only men with effort, intelligence, perseverance, and efficiency can run a city. Many faithful and conscientious citizens, along with many City Council Members have been responsible for the progress and improvements in South Ogden.

Henry Guy Child 1936-1945

H. Guy Child, a warm-hearted, gifted, enthusiastic and religious man lived up to his beliefs. He was the first mayor of South Ogden City.

He was born in Riverdale, Weber County, Utah on September 25, 1884, a son of Henry H. Child and Mary Eliza Thompson Child. He was the third child in a family of twelve children.

John Major Reese 1946-1949

John M. Reese, second mayor of South Ogden, was born in the little town of Wales, Utah, where people were very friendly and very concerned about each other. He was the only son of John Davis and Sarah Major Reese, and grew up with two sisters.

He attended district school in Wales until twelve years of age, and then moved with his family to Salt Lake City where he continued his education. He graduated from the LDS High School and received his Masters Degree from the University of Utah. He was a member of Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society.

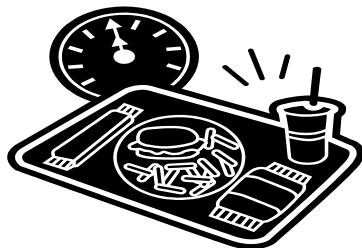

Public Works Department

The Public Works Department would like to remind residents about a few upcoming events. The **Senior & Disabled Citizen Curbside Spring Cleanup** will be held beginning May 2, 2011. Sign ups will be held April 4th, 2011 through April 22, 2011. **South Ogden Cleanup Program and Mixed/Green Waste Trailer/Rolloff rentals** will begin April 4, 2011. Prices for the trailer are \$45.00/\$55.00 for a green waste trailer/rolloff and \$80.00/\$100.00 for a mixed waste trailer/rolloff. \$100.00 deposit is required with each rental. The Neighborhood Cleanup Program requires a \$100 deposit plus five signatures from your neighbors who will be participating in the cleanup.

Spring is just around the corner and we want to remind of South Ogden City's Storm Drain Regulations. • No chemicals should be poured into the storm drain system (gutters, storm boxes, etc.) because these empty into drainage fields and streams, which then go into the rivers and water supplies in this area. Chemicals pollute the ground and/or water supplies, harming the environment and habitat. • When washing your vehicles or other items outside, use environmentally friendly, biodegradable soaps. • When using pesticides or garden products also use environmentally friendly products. Use garden products (fertilizers, etc.) as directed so no over spray will wash down the gutters. Too much spray will kill your lawn.

Anyone dumping into the gutters or storm drain system will open themselves up to criminal prosecution, as well as, civil action obligating them for all costs in the cleanup of all the areas it may affect downstream. Please notify South Ogden Public Works Department at 622-2900 if someone is dumping anything into gutters or storm drains.

From the Police Department: With school in midsession, cell phone "sexting" cases are more common. A surprising new report estimates teens are "sexting" far more than first thought.

The survey, from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children and Cox Communications, found one in five teens has sexted; which means they have sent suggestive, nude or nearly-nude photos of themselves over e-mail or cell phone to someone else.

In order to combat the problem, the South Ogden Detective's Division firmly believes that parents need to check on [teens'] cell phones, know the passwords to their Facebook, MySpace page, and Twitter accounts, and have a good open line of communication with your teen. This is the only way we're ever going to get a handle on this problem. Parents need to be actively involved in their children's lives.

We are encouraging parents to have shared cell phone plans with their children, and request that their service providers forward their teens' messages, texts, and mailed pictures to them. Now-days, many cell phone providers offer this service. You may also call the police department with specific questions.

Animal Services: Spring is coming, don't forget your pet as you get ready to enjoy summer. Roaming dogs without identification are rarely re-united with their owner because the finders believe them to be abandoned, and sometimes keep them. Please make sure your dog has a collar and an ID tag with your CURRENT phone number and a South Ogden License. If your pet is lost but is wearing current ID, the finder will probably call YOU first. You may be able to avoid impound fees and/or citations that way. Another way to insure your pet gets re-united with you if he/she becomes lost is getting that pet a microchip. If you find a lost dog, please contact Animal Control at 801-622-2949 or non emergency dispatch at 801-629-8221, to help re-unite the dog with their family.

With spring, comes roaming dogs and females in heat. According to South Ogden Ordinances, it is unlawful for your FEMALE DOG IN HEAT to be outside unattended. It causes a public nuisance because it will attract male dogs and cause aggressive behavior. The best remedy? HAVE YOUR PET SPAYED or NEUTERED! Licensing is cheaper, and your dog will be healthier and less likely to roam. The **Big Fix** will be coming to our city on Wednesday, March 16th. They offer discount vaccinations and micro chip services. For more information, go to www.utahpets.org or call 1-866-738-7349. From the Fire Department: We all know the importance of early warning when it comes to a fire breaking out. In its initial phase, a fire can grow quietly and unknowingly until it is too late to be extinguished easily by a fire extinguisher. A fire more than doubles its size and intensity every 60 seconds, so getting out early literally means the difference between survival and being trapped. Smoke detectors are the leading cause of survival in dwelling fires. And in the state of Utah, having them installed in your home is law.
