South Ogden Mayors have served its citizens for the past 75 years, with devotion and dignity.

**Mayor Fred L. Montmorency
1962 – 1969**

Mr. Montmorency, a tall, intelligent, industrious man who has a deep love for the great outdoors, has lived in South Ogden for years with his devoted and lovely wife, Sally.

He was born in McCook, Nebraska, on February 18, 1900. He then lived in Omaha from 1901 to 1918. He graduated from Central High School in Omaha in February 1918, and on March 1, 1918, enlisted in the United States Regular Army. He served for 13 months including six months overseas in France.

He married Sarah Poget Frederick in Los Angeles in 1926. They have one son Frederick, who is an architect in Salt Lake City.

**Harvey R. Hegstrom
1970 – 1973**

In 1970, the people of South Ogden went to the polls and elected Harvey R. Hegstrom sixth Mayor of their city.

He was born in a small farming community on April 10, 1915, in southeastern Idaho in a little town called Central, attending school there.

He married Sarah Stephensen in 1936, and they are the parents of four children, Lucille, Harvey Jr., Louise, and Karen.

He served 10 years as a councilman and was then elected Mayor for four years. Many beautiful homes were being built at this time and South Ogden was on the map. It was called the "City of Beautiful Homes."

Weber Basin Water Conservancy District Tips and Activities

Tips—Now that you have begun watering lawns and gardens again take the time to set up your sprinkler timer to water appropriately for the season. For May, you will likely only need to irrigate once every 7 to 10 days (weather dependent). As the temperatures increase you will water more frequently. Adjust the schedule based on the season to both conserve water and provide adequate water for a healthy landscape. A monthly adjustment will help to conserve and maximize plant health.

Activities—Saturday, May 14 from 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. free class on "Weeds, Bugs and Garden Pests". Wednesday, May 25 from 6:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. free class on "Homemade Compost". The June Garden Fair will be on Saturday, June 4 from 8:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. There will be classes, activities, tours, free food and opportunities to buy plants. The Garden Fair and all classes will be held at the Weber Basin Water Conservancy District Learning Garden located at 2837 East Highway 193 in Layton.

Public Works Department

Spring is here and we want to remind you of South Ogden City's Storm Drain Regulations.

- No chemicals should be poured into the storm drain system (gutters, storm boxes, etc.) because these empty into drainage fields and streams, which then go into the rivers and water supplies in this area. Chemicals pollute the ground and/or water supplies, harming the environment and habitat.
- When washing your vehicles or other items outside, use environmentally friendly, biodegradable soaps.
- When using pesticides or garden products also use environmentally friendly products. Use garden products (fertilizers, etc.) as directed so no over spray will wash down the gutters. Too much spray will kill your lawn.

Individuals caught dumping the above mentioned items into city gutters or storm drain system will be criminally prosecuted and may be required to pay all costs associated with the cleanup of areas it may affect downstream. Please notify South Ogden Public Works Department at 801-622-2900 if you suspect or witness illegal dumping into our storm drain system.

South Ogden Cleanup Program and Mixed/Green Waste Trailer/Rolloff Rentals—Prices for the trailer/rolloff are \$45/\$55 for a green waste trailer/rolloff and \$80/\$100 for a mixed waste trailer/rolloff. A \$100 deposit is required with each rental. The Neighborhood Cleanup Program requires a \$100 deposit plus five signatures from your neighbors who will be participating in the cleanup. The \$100 deposit check will be cashed and a refund check will be issued within 14 days of dumping of the trailer/rolloff, unless any of the rules stated on the application are violated. The application and fees need to be turned in to the Public Works Department located at 5590 S. 600 E. and must be received at least 48 hours prior to delivery.
