Bonneville Cone Communities that Care

Something great has happened in the Bonneville Cone area! Four cities including; Riverdale, South Ogden, Washington Terrace and Uintah, have recently signed an interlocal agreement to form the *Bonneville Cone Communities that Care*. Your next question may be, "What is Communities that Care (CTC) and how can it help my community?" CTC is a prevention framework that helps a community support healthy youth development and protect against problem behaviors in adolescence by reducing risk factors that youth are exposed to in their daily lives and enhancing protective factors to buffer those risks. It does this by identifying tested and effective programs and implements them into a community based on their specific needs for their local youth. In addition, CTC also:

- Takes a practical, research-based, outcome-focused approach that involves the whole community in promoting positive youth development.
- Can help our community use prevention science research to enhance how our community, schools, families and youth groups operate to prevent youth behavior problems and promote healthy development.
- Can help use our money, efforts and energy efficiently and effectively by using objective data to determine priorities, implementing programs that have been shown to work, and give us the tools to measure and track results.
- Brings four cities together whose youth filter into Bonneville High School, therefore, creating a more effective approach to addressing specific youth issues for this community.

2012 Voting Information

South Ogden residents will be voting to fill three open city council seats in this year's municipal election. All council seats are at-large, four year term positions.

Due to the number of candidates running, a primary election will be held. Residents will be able to vote for three candidates. The six candidates receiving the most votes will proceed to the general election.

The primary election will be held on **September 13** and the general election will be held on **November 8**.

There will be two polling locations on election day: Precincts 1-6 will vote at City Hall (3950 Adams Ave.) and precincts 7-12 will vote in the gymnasium at the new South Junior High School (650 E 5700 S) See map at right. The gym is on the north side of the school and can be accessed from 700 East. Polls will be open from 7a.m. to 8 p.m.

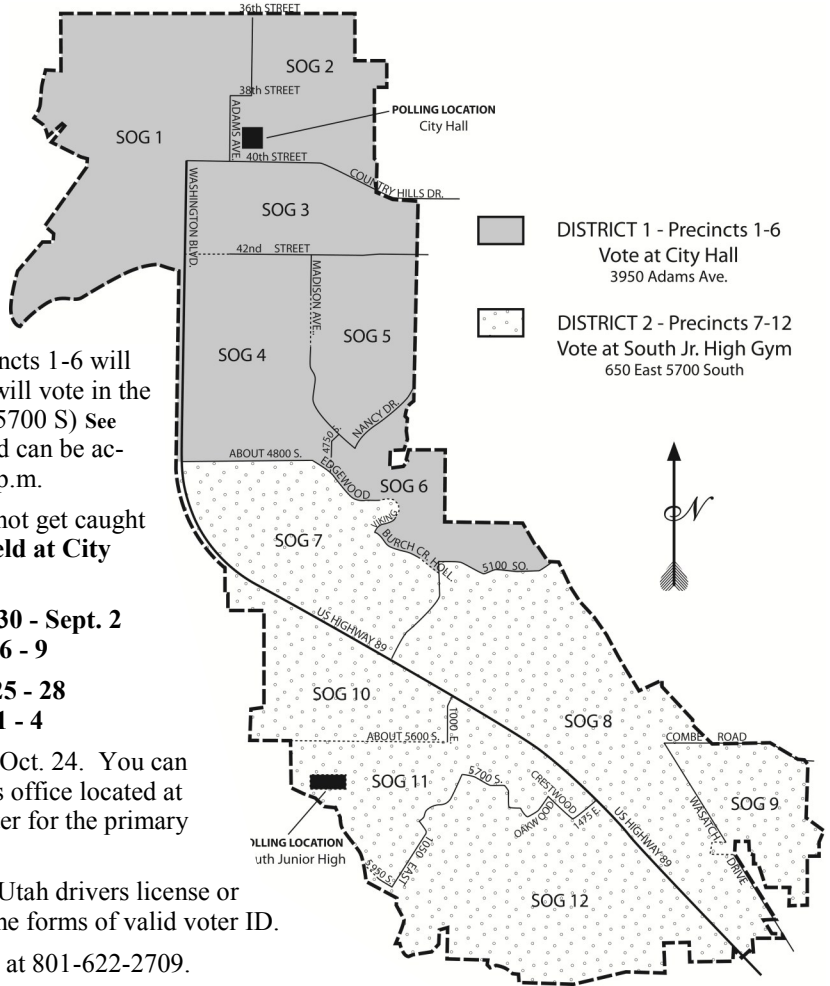
Early voting is a great way to beat election day lines and not get caught in bad weather. **Early voting for all precincts will be held at City Hall from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. on the following dates:**

- Primary Early Voting:** (Tues.-Fri.) **Aug. 30 - Sept. 2**
(Tues.-Fri.) **Sept. 6 - 9**
- General Early Voting:** (Tues.-Fri.) **Oct. 25 - 28**
(Tues.-Fri.) **Nov. 1 - 4**

You can still register to vote in the general election until Oct. 24. You can register online at vote.utah.gov or at the county recorder's office located at 2380 Washington Blvd., Suite 320. It is too late to register for the primary election.

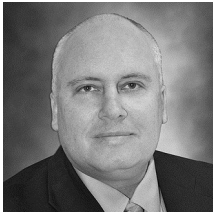
You are now required to show ID when voting; a current Utah drivers license or ID card issued by the state or a valid US passport are some forms of valid voter ID.
