Christmas Tree Recycling

South Ogden Public Works Department will recycle your discarded Christmas tree. Please bring your tree to one of the areas listed below beginning January 3, 2012 through January 20, 2012. We **will not** pick up trees at any other locations. Stands, nails, ornaments, lights, etc. that could damage the chipper need to be removed and put into your regular garbage. **Please do not discard any paper, garbage or trash at the recycling areas.** Thank you for your on-going support in recycling. If you have any questions, please call 622-2900. Listed below are Christmas tree recycling locations:

1. 560 39th across the street, in front of the bowery on the curb
2. Club Heights Park parking lot
3. Madison Avenue Park parking lot
4. Friendship Park parking lot
5. Meadows Park, approx. 5725 South 2000 East at the end of the cul-de-sac in front of the park

Public Works Reminders

Snow Removal: Any property owner and/or persons occupying property are responsible for removing snow from the sidewalks that border the property. It is unlawful to deposit snow and ice into the road.

No Parking: It is illegal to park or leave anything on the road from **November 1 to April 1 between the hours of 1 a.m. and 7 a.m.** (with the exception of physicians and authorized emergency personnel). Parking interferes with snow removal. Parking is prohibited during or after a snowstorm. It is unlawful for anyone to park or leave a vehicle for more than 48 hours on any street, public road, alley, or municipal property. **Plows will not return to clear snow from areas where a vehicle has been parked.**

Depositing On Streets Prohibited: It shall be unlawful for any person to remove snow, ice or slush from private property and thereafter to deposit by any means or device upon any city street. A citation will be issued for depositing snow, ice, etc. on city streets.

Mailboxes: Mailboxes that are damaged by a City snowplow will only be replaced by the City if they comply with the policy for proper installation. This requires the closest part of the mailbox or structure at least 4 feet above ground with the front of the box even with or behind the curb. The posts cannot be rotten where the weight of the snow breaks the post. Residents are required to keep area clear for delivery.

Trash Cans: need to be removed from gutters as it makes it difficult for street sweeping and snow removal.

Snow Caves: Please do not let children build snow caves anywhere around the park strips or driveway entrances. It can be very dangerous to children and snow plows drivers.

Animal Services News - Dog license renewal forms have been sent out. If you haven't returned yours yet, this is a friendly reminder to do so. If you have a dog and did not receive a letter, all dogs in South Ogden are required to be licensed. Please call us at 801-622-2800 or stop by the Police Department Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

There was a misprint in our dog licenses letters. For a spayed or neutered dog (that is not a senior), it listed the cost was \$20.00. The correct price for an (non-senior) altered dog is \$12.00. If you haven't mailed yours yet, please send \$12.00 instead of the \$20.00. For those who have already mailed the \$20.00, you will be receiving a \$8.00 refund. We apologize for any inconvenience.


Fire Department News—Practice Fireplace Safety: A fireplace is a fantastic feature and a cozy way to warm up a room, but it's important to have yours inspected and cleaned annually. Make sure your fireplace is properly vented to the outside and inspect it for any leaks in the exhaust pipe. Clean your chimney regularly or hire a professional to do the job.

Never leave a fire unattended under any circumstances. Be sure your children understand fireplace safety and monitor them and your pets at all times when they are around a burning fireplace.

Police Department News—Don't Be A Victim of Burglary: In order to keep your families, homes and vehicles safe, here are some tips from the Detective Division of the South Ogden Police Department. 1) Please keep your doors and windows locked, both home and vehicle 2) Be aware of your property. Keep valuables out of public view. This includes purses, checkbooks, computers, cameras, jewelry 3) Report any suspicious activities, day or night. If you see something occurring, call immediately with any descriptions you can give, but don't hesitate to call even if it's after the fact. The smallest amount of information may be the tip to solve the case! Keep a watch out for people walking down the street looking at homes or vehicles, vehicles you've never seen before that may be parked in your vacationing neighbor's driveways. Even neighbors that are usually at work – if there is someone at their home that you don't recognize, call us. Solicitors also need to be watched 4) While you are thinking about it, grab a pen and paper and start writing down the make, model, and serial numbers of your valuables, including your firearms. If you can get pictures of them, it would help should we get called to your home 5) If you leave for vacation, leave lights on in your home. Have someone you trust come to the home at least once a day and check on things. Let us know you will be gone so we can add extra patrols to the area.

Your recycle service day will be every other week on the same day as your trash service according to the designated weeks on the above calendar. Your schedule week is the SHADED week ONLY. Items that can be recycled:

- Newspapers, magazines, phone books, office paper, junk mail, shredded paper (in bags)
- Tin and aluminum cans
- 1 through 7 plastics in bottle form
- Corrugated cardboard, cereal boxes, paper egg cartons, brown grocery bags, plastic film
- Small appliances (irons, toaster, pots and pans, cookware, metal clothes hangers, copper, brass and scrap aluminum)

Items that cannot be recycled:

- Glass (any kind)
- Motor oil bottles, yard waste, paint cans, wood
- Bathroom waste (paper towels & tissue, diapers)
- Aluminum foil, microwavable cardboard, food stained material
- Styrofoam, bubble wrap, packing peanuts
- Plastic toys
