In August 2011, South Ogden residents recycled 82 tons of recyclable items. These recycling efforts conserved the following resources: 1,223 mature trees were saved (representing enough saved timber resources to produce more than 15,157,700 sheets of newspaper), 298 cubic yards of landfill airspace (representing enough airspace to fulfill the municipal waste disposal needs for 383 people for one year), 175 barrels of oil (representing enough energy to heat and cool more than 36 homes for one year) and 510,300 gallon of water (representing enough fresh water needs of more than 6,804 people).
